

Art History Hats 'n Shoes



Your next assignment is to create a painted shoe or hat sculpture based on a famous art movement or work of art! You will be given two library periods to research various “isms” and artists. Once you have chosen your favorite art movement and/or artist, you will then have seven days to draw/transpose your design(s) and paint your shoe or hat in your chosen art style using acrylic paints. When selecting your shoe or hat, feel free to recycle one that may be destined for the trash (with your parents’ permission of course!) and look for shapes and details that might also work with your particular design. Remember, the more tattered or quirky your shoe or hat is, the more interesting your final result may be. You may also consider adding creative touches like cardboard shapes, tin foil, pipecleaners, wire, yarn, buttons, beads, etc to reinforce the particular art style you have chosen.
